Kaluwewa model village

Around 150 of these illegal cage nets were found after the raid on Tuesday. The nets are valued at around five million rupees.

Puttalam fisheries office Deputy Director told that these nets are illegal because young fish also get caught in these nets, and this prevents the growth of certain fish species.

He further said that these cage nets are rented out by a group of businessmen in the area, and fishermen lay them in the sea around Kalpitiya. Naval officials from the Kalpitiya Vijaya Navy camp assisted the fisheries officials in the raid.
